Charity tournament takes on new look

Monday's Beau's Buddies Cancer Fund Golf Tournament has a new twist.

Instead of professional players Will MacKenzie and James Driscoll participating in a skins game, that pair is now scheduled to take on local pros Brady Pinner and Kevin Williams in a nine-hole match play event at Greenville Country Club, tournament organizers confirmed on Thursday.

Dubbed the Thrilla in Greenville, the pros are scheduled to begin match play at 3:30 p.m. Monday. It costs \$40 per person to watch the pros, who will be wearing microphones while they play.

Pinner is the pro at GCC, while Williams is the ECU women's golf coach.

MacKenzie is a J.H. Rose graduate who has earned \$274,306 on the PGA Tour so far this season.

The tournament is scheduled to start at 9:30 a.m. Monday. As of Tuesday, 18 four-person teams had signed up to play with all the proceeds going to Beau's Buddies Cancer Fund.

The second annual charity event will be held in honor of Hugh Parham "Beau" Stanley, a young boy who died from neuroblastoma when he was a little more than a year old.
